- (a) in the course of representing C.D. in a family matter:
 - (i) breaching the terms of one or more of the orders made by the Honourable Mr. Justice Bowden (the "Publication Ban") and by the Honourable Madam Justice Marzari (the "Anonymization Order" and the "Protection Order"), by posting on-line, causing to be posted on-line or failing to remove from on-line, one or more of eight documents, when he knew or ought to have known that doing so was contrary to one or more of the Publication Ban, Anonymization Order, Protection Order and rules 2.1-1(a) and 2.2-1 of the *Code of Professional Conduct for British Columbia* ("the *Code"*); and
 - (ii) breaching the terms of the order made by the Honourable Madam Justice Marzari (the "Protection Order"), by making one or more statements in interviews with media outlets that were reproduced in one or both of two documents posted on-line when he knew or ought to have known that doing so was contrary to one or more of the Protection Order and rules 2.1-1(a) and 2.2-1 of the *Code*.
 - (b) in the course of representing A.M. in a family matter, breaching the terms of an order made by the Honourable Mr. Justice Brundrett (the "Brundrett Order"), by emailing a copy of the Brundrett Order and a related sealing order to the editor of a legal publication when he knew or ought to have known that doing so was contrary to one or more of the Brundrett Order and rules 2.1-1(a) and 2.2-1 of the *Code*.
